




EU & Canada trade



CETA Benefits

Increased competitiveness

-- removes 99% of Canada's tariff lines.

Access to market(s)

- -- offers access to one of G7 country
- -- better access to Government procurement in Canada at federal, provincial & local levels.

Simplified procedures

- -- simplifies clearing goods through customs
- -- facilitation or test results and products certification from the other party
- -- offers improved labor mobility provisions

Focus on Luxembourg

- -- **129** Luxembourgish companies export to Canada.
- -- 1 200 jobs in Luxembourg supported by EU exports to Canada 865,000


